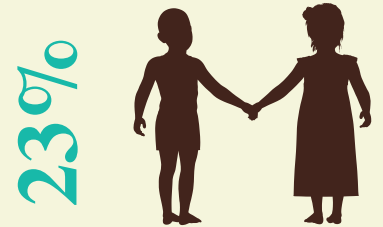

SERVICES



Outreach and Engagement & Crisis Intervention Services

provide 24-hour, professionally staffed emergency housing assistance, including individuals and families who are unsheltered, living in uninhabitable places or those who are at immediate risk of losing shelter.

Stable Housing Programs help eliminate crises, provide secure & safe housing units, and assist households with obtaining permanent housing, including permanent supportive housing, rapid re-housing and affordable market rate units.

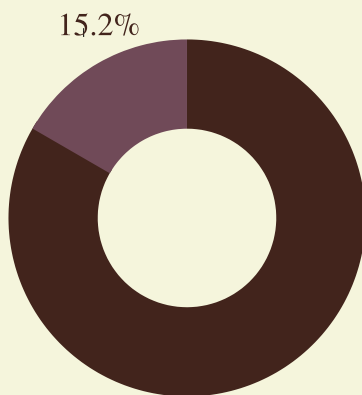
Comprehensive Case Management provides individually tailored, team-based professional services which address the barriers to obtaining and maintaining permanent housing. Services include mental health & substance abuse treatment and educational & vocational training and placement.

Services to Veterans and their families who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless include outreach, system navigation, stable housing, permanent housing and prevention services for those experiencing housing instability.

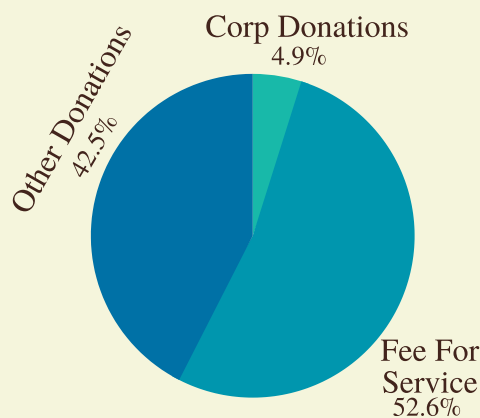
Featherfist also provides supportive services to senior citizens residing in senior housing and veterans residing in housing other than Featherfist's. Housing location placement is made for persons exiting nursing homes and persons who are engaged in services with anti-violence providers throughout the city.

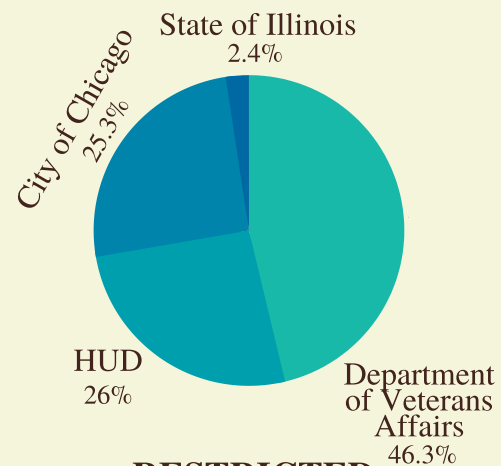

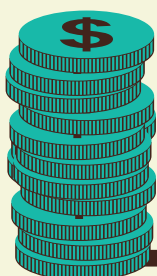
